On Sunday, August 5, DJ Eric Prydz, also known as Pryda, will perform at local nightclub, Coliseum. This will be the Swedish native's first tour in America since 2007. Prydz rarely travels outside Europe due to an extreme fear of flying, so his Coliseum debut will be a special affair for electronic music fans.

Prydz was one of the first artists to make use of holograms and 3D animation and rotational mapping in a live performance, which he premiered at his EPIC (Eric Prydz in Concert) show in 2011 at the O2 Brixton Academy Arena in London.

"I wanted a new show that expressed my music in a visual context," said Prydz in a press release. "I want to push the boundaries of a live electronic music show with technology that hasn't been used before and to give my

fans an experience that they will never forget."

While Prydz has been performing since 2001, he released his first album, Eric Prydz Presents Pryda, this past May. The three-disc collection contains both unreleased and newly re-edited versions of songs from the older Pryda catalogue. Prydz is making a stop in Tallahassee as a solo show, before reuniting with the Identity Festival Tour, which he is headlining this summer, along with Excision, Datsik, and an array of big

names in electronic music. His Coliseum performance was coordinated by by No Sugar Added, a Miami-based electronic music brand responsible for putting on over 300 shows around the world.
