On Friday, Sept. 14, The Strip Entertainment Complex will present The Fall Ball, featuring world class DJ, Kaskadee, and openers Sunnery James and Ryan Marciano.

Chicago native, Ryan Raddon, known by his stage name Kaskadee, has been named America's No. 1 DJ by both Pioneer DJ and DJ Times, his style opening doors for numerous electronic dance music (EDM) artists, such as Skrillex and Deadmau5.

In the music scene for over a decade, he recently released his seventh studio album in Oct. 2011, *Fire and Ice*. Kaskadee's name originates from a picture of a waterfall in a nature book, and a colleague's advice that "Cascade" would be a fitting name for a DJ, with a slight spelling change.

Kaskade has proven himself to be a chart topper on *Billboard Magazine's* Hot Dance Club Play chart, with singles like "Steppin' Out," reaching No. 5, "Everything," reaching No. 1, "Be Still" at No. 4, and "Stars Align" at No. 11. He has graced *Billboard's* Dance Radio Airplay chart with singles "Steppin' Out" at No. 6, "Sorry" at No. 9, "Angel on my Shoulder" at No. 5, and "Move for Me," reaching the top spot at No. 1. "I Remember," a collaboration with Deadmau5, made the top 15 on the UK Singles Chart, marking Kaskade's first hit to reach the

United Kingdom. Earlier this year, Kaskade headlined multiple music festivals, including Ultra Music Festival in Miami, Coachella Valley Music Festival in California and the *Electric Daisy Carnival* in Las Vegas.

During the summer of 2011, Kaskade was planning a block party performance outside of Grauman's Chinese Theater in Los Angeles to celebrate the premiere of Electric Daisy Carnival's documentary, *Electric Daisy Carnival Experience*, when a riot broke out. The Los Angeles Police Department fought off the large crowds that came for Kaskade's free show prior to the screening. Due to the chaos outside the theater, less than half of the invited guests made it inside the theater, as most were informed by police the screening had been called off.

Kaskade began exploring his talents in his dorm room at Brigham Young University in Utah in 1989. He later moved on to own his own record store in Salt Lake City, Mechanized Records, and also worked for Om Records as an Artists and Repertoire assistant, where he started in May of 2000.

Kaskade's early albums were recorded with Om, but in 2006, he signed with Ultra Records, producing music with the company ever since.

Opens Dutch House DJs, Sunnery James and Ryan Marciano have been a pair for three years, and perform in countries across the world. The duo has reworked several of Kaskade's songs, along with music by fellow DJs, Sander Kleinenberg and Ferry Corsten.
